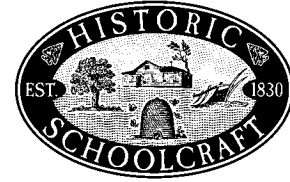

Summer is here and there are plenty of activities and events happening in the Village of Schoolcraft beginning with the 87th Annual Independence Day Celebration taking place on Wednesday, July 4th. For the first time, both northbound and southbound lanes will be closed to traffic during the parade. For those of you who have friends and family coming to watch the parade, be sure to let them know to arrive well in advance of the road closure (10:50 a.m.) in order to secure a parking area.

In addition to the parade, there are many other activities going on too. Start your day by going to the Lions Club Pancake Breakfast located at the Schoolcraft Upper Elementary School between the hours of 7 to 11 a.m. Be sure to stop at Burch Park for the annual Car Show, the American Legion for chicken and ribs, the Ice Cream Social sponsored by the United Methodist Church and much more.

During the month of July, we invite you to enjoy Music in the Park beginning at 6:00 p.m. (unless noted otherwise). Bring a blanket and come over to Burch Park for an entertaining night of music and relaxation.

The Farmer's Market is held every Wednesday at the Schoolcraft United Methodist Church on N. Grand Street 2-6 p.m. They have fresh fruits, vegetables, eggs, baked items including desserts and breads. There are plenty of items to choose from and we encourage you to stop by and see all it has to offer.

For those of you history buffs, the Schoolcraft Historical Society meets on the first Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the Underground Railroad House. Each month, a guest speaker talks about a historical event in and around the State of Michigan. It is quite an experience to hear and learn a bit of history about Michigan and Schoolcraft, and I encourage you to take advantage of this unique opportunity.

Allowing a Dog to Run at Large: Any person who owns a dog within the limits of the Village must keep the dog under immediate control with a leash or chain when the dog is not on the owners property.

Junk Vehicles: Any vehicle which is not licensed and insured for operation on the highway or is inoperable is in violation. The vehicle in question cannot be on a person's property for more than 10 days at any time within a calendar year. A vehicle which meets the criteria of being a junk vehicle may be kept on the property if it is placed in an entirely enclosed structure (garage).

Blight: Building materials, junk, trash rubbish or refuse of any kind may not be kept outside for a period exceeding 30 days.

Lawn, Noxious Weeds: Weeds or grass may not exceed 12 inches. A person served notice for this violation has 48 hours to cut the weeds or grass.

Right of Way: With the exception of decorative flowers, a resident may not place any structure, sign or other object within the right of way (33' from the center of the roadway). Basketball hoops can be placed off the roadway on the right of way in a cul-de-sac from March through October.

Parking: A person may not park their vehicle on the paved portion of the roadway within the village limits unless a curb is present. A person may not park on the right of way between 2-6 a.m. unless the person is the property owner or a visitor of the owner.

Curfew: Any person 16 years or younger may not be out on public property between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. There are some exceptions. The curfew ordinance is meant for juveniles walking around the village during these hours. Both the juvenile and parent can be cited for this violation.

Golf Carts: A golf cart may not be operated on a public highway in this state unless it is registered, insured and has all required equipment of a motor vehicle. This is not a local ordinance but is State Law. There are exceptions during certain special events (parades etc.) for a specified amount of time.

Sidewalk Use: Operation of motorized vehicles is not permitted on sidewalks unless a person is disabled. Bicycles must yield to pedestrians walking on a sidewalk. Bike riding is not permitted on sidewalks in the business district.

A Bit of History Schoolcraft Food Pantry

MANAGE YOUR LIBRARY ACCOUNT FROM HOME

It is now possible for patrons of the library to manage their own library account from the comfort of their own home and their own computer. Just go to www.schoolcraftlibrary.org and click on Search Catalog twice and then Schoolcraft Community Library. Then click on Create Account and set up your own account by creating your own user name and password. Once that is done click Save and go to My Info. From there you should be able to see what you have checked out, what fines you have, if any, renew your materials and place materials on hold. You can also create Resource Lists of materials to refer to later if you so desire. It's easy and can be done anytime not just when the library is open. Questions?? Call the library at 679-5959.

KINDLE USERS BEWARE

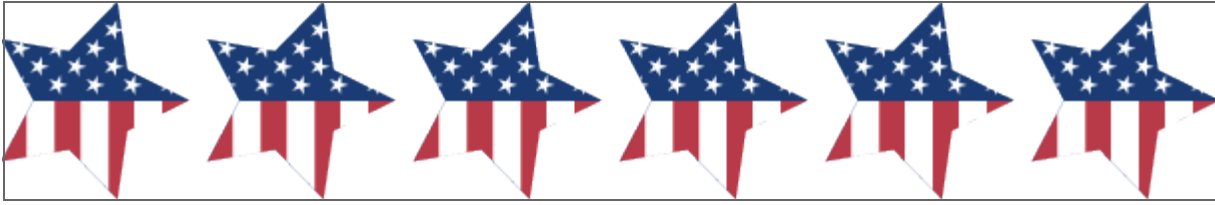
The introduction of Overdrive to library patrons sometime in March 2012 was an exciting milestone for the Schoolcraft Community Library and its patrons. Now patrons with electronic devices such as Nooks, Kindles, MP3 players etc. are able to download books and audios to their devices from their home computers. It has been a long awaited service and has been received with much enthusiasm. It seems, however, that those patrons with Kindles should be aware that when using this service, they make it possible for Amazon to acquire and keep a lot of information about themselves as library users and their reading habits and using that data to market goods to them later. This information—along with the Kindle customer's use of the e-book---was, per Amazon's terms of service, subject to Amazon's standard commercial privacy policies. These policies differ a great deal from our policies that support the librarian's professional commitment to the core values of intellectual freedom, privacy and access. However, libraries have no control over Amazon's marketing strategies and/or policies, so the Schoolcraft Community Library thought it would be prudent to at least inform those patrons who are Kindle users that Amazon has the ability to gather data about you and then use it for marketing purposes, as well as the ability to erase or modify content that has already been downloaded to your device in an attempt to avoid a controversy over content. So, we are not telling you to stop using your Kindle, but just trying to inform you of the privacy risks involved when you do use your device. If you would like more information you may stop at the library and ask for a copy of the current article called A Digital Dilemma: Ebooks and Users' Rights.
